Vetting and Barring Scheme

You may have heard the announcement made by the Government on Tuesday 15 June that the further implementation of the Vetting and Barring Scheme (VBS) in England, Wales and Northern Ireland will not now go ahead as planned.

In order to carry out this review the Government have halted the planned implementation of the scheme.

Whilst the VBS will not now be implemented as planned, the requirement for Criminal Records Bureau (CRB) and Access Northern Ireland (ANI) disclosures remain unchanged. In Scouting CRB checks are therefore still required for those who:

- wish to become a Member or Associate Member; or
- may have unsupervised access to young people; or
- will have involvement with the handling or management of funds; or
- will be assisting with overnight activities (including Nights Away); or
- will be helping out once a month or more.

Skills instructors and Trainers needed.
